
The Specially Created Exhibition

In the Hagi · Kitaura district, there were two different kinds of whaling, old and modern, which was a prosperous livelihood and a lot of whales have migrated to the waters of the Sea of Japan since ancient times. However, people around here have not had a close affinity and a deep interest in whales. Therefore, we adopted the Hagiscape into the scene of the fairy tale "Pinocchio", resulting in a magnificent narrative type exhibition of about 20 different kinds of whales which migrated to these waters.
